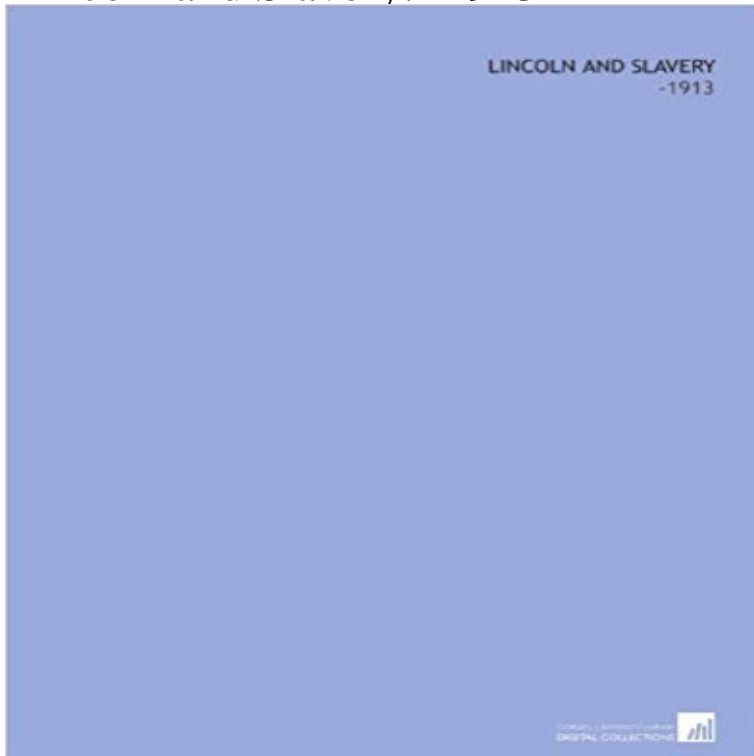


# Lincoln and Slavery: -1913
