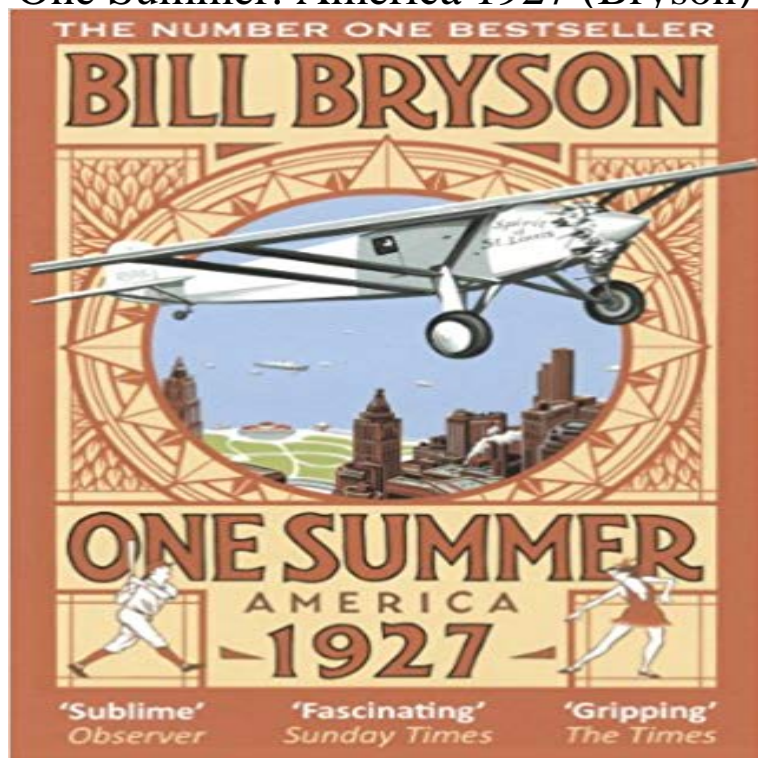


One Summer: America 1927 (Bryson)
