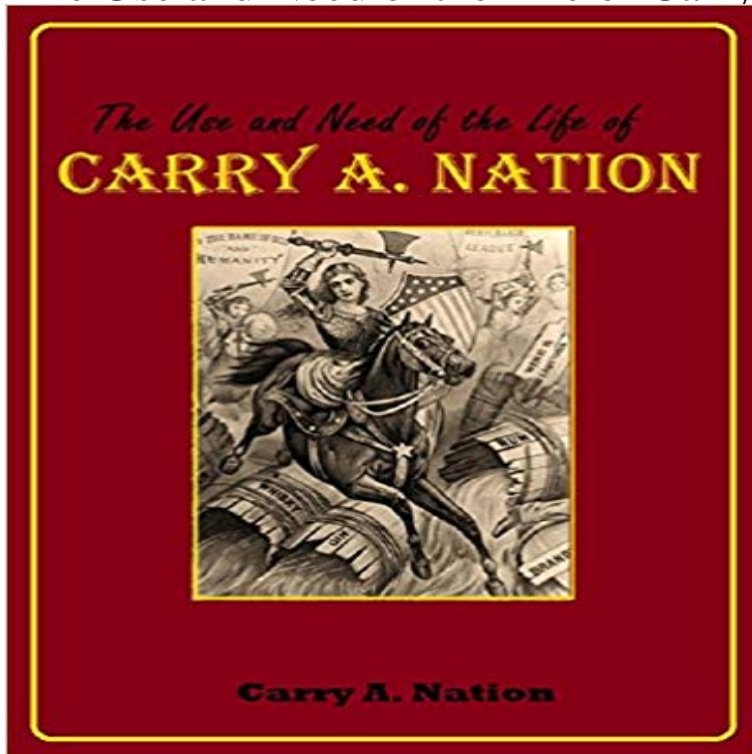


The Use and Need of the Life of Carry A. Nation [Illustrated]



About the author Carrie Amelia Moore Nation (1846–1911) was an American woman who was a radical member of the temperance movement, which opposed alcohol before the advent of Prohibition. She is particularly noteworthy for attacking the property of alcohol-serving establishments (most often taverns) with a hatchet. Nation was a relatively large woman, almost 6 feet (180 cm) tall and weighing 175 pounds (79 kg). She described herself as a bulldog running along at the feet of Jesus, barking at what He doesn't like, and claimed a divine ordination to promote temperance by destroying bars.
