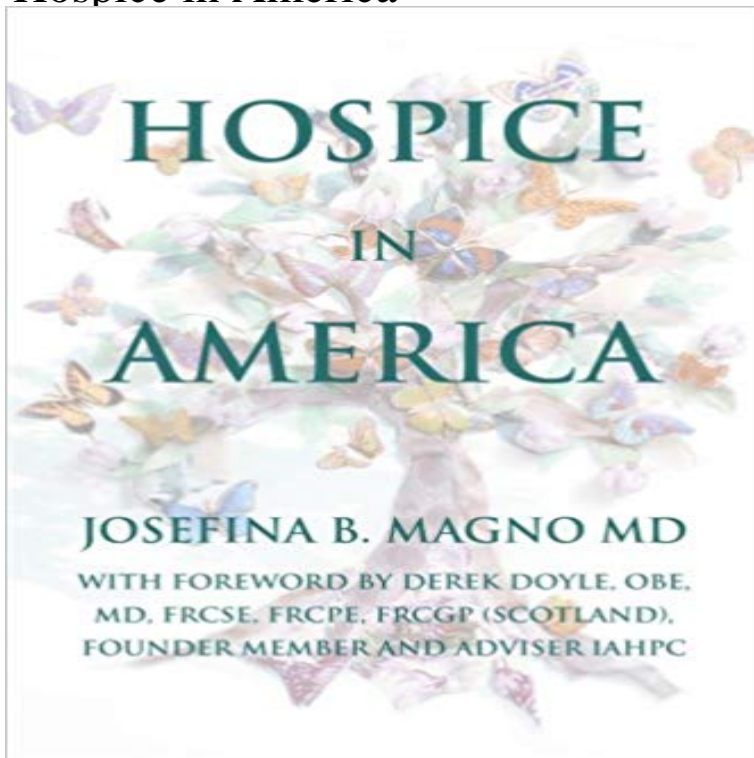


Hospice in America
